



Bruce Warren Tucker Jr.

April 24, 1932 - February 3, 2016

Bruce Warren Tucker, Jr., 83, departed this world for heaven February 3, 2016 at Good Samaritan Regional Medical Center in Corvallis.

Born April 24, 1932 in Roanoke Rapids, North Carolina, Bruce grew up in Winston-Salem, North Carolina with one younger brother, William Tucker (deceased).

Bruce will be lovingly remembered by his wife of 46 years, Ruth; his son, Bruce Tucker III and daughter-in-law, Tricia; and his grandchildren, Emmerson and Weston. Bruce will also be fondly remembered by Jo Wright, his first wife and mother of his son; by his brother's wife and children; and by countless other friends and family.

Bruce attended Harris Art School in Nashville, Tennessee, then served in the Air Force during the Korean War (1952-57). After deployment in Korea, while stationed in the States he completed coursework at Baylor University, Texas.

He began his career in the 60s, balancing work in advertising and fine art up through the 90s. During this period, which saw the decline of traditional hand-rendered art and the emergence of digital art, he worked steadily, adhering to the importance of design and its supporting elements – action, dominance, rhythm, balance, texture, focus and color.

Those were also guidelines in how he lived his life, one that was well-rendered and marked by an appreciation for beauty to his final days with loved ones here, and now in perpetual glorified beauty with the savior and creator of all beauty, Jesus Christ.
