In 2006 Leneé began losing her eye sight and at the same time she suffered from a back injury. a day came when her eye sight was totally gone and the back injury was so severe that it caused her to live the rest of her life (about 90%) in bed. This made her life incredibly difficult, although with her faith and love for God she reached deep down inside fo herself and raised above it mentally. She found a way to live life in that bed. From time to time she would get up and go out, mostly to celebrate a birthday or a special occasion, as a result, going out always took a toll on Leneé because of the back pain, but it never stopped her. While in bed she loved listening to story books on tape. This was her way of traveling the world in her mind. She loved her boys with a passion. Everyday after school she would have them tell her about their day. She would have them get up there in her bed to tell her every detail, there was no leaving anything out; she had them paint a picture in her mind.

When it came to her family and friends she always made herself available with a hug, words of encouragement and prayer. She never let you off the phone without praying for

you first.

She was loved deeply and she will be missed forever.
