Marilyn Joyce Nordyke, 88, died Saturday, January 20, in Corvallis.

Marilyn was born October 5, 1929, to Clarence A. and Ruth Weston Pugsley, in Fresno, California. The family moved to Philomath in 1934, then later to Corvallis. After graduating from Corvallis High School in 1948, Marilyn attended Oregon State College, and then began her career as a secretary at OSC. She retired in 1979 as an administrative assistant in the OSU School of Agriculture.

On April 16, 1950, Marilyn married Ramon Nordyke at the First Presbyterian Church in Corvallis. Fifty years later they renewed their vows in the same church. They took their first trip to Hawaii to celebrate their 25th anniversary and were hooked. They went to Hawaii nearly every year after that, usually for their anniversary, and often with family members joining them. They also traveled to New Zealand, Tahiti, the Bahamas, and across the United States.

Marilyn enjoyed and created humor. She loved to cross-stitch, watch OSU sports, and travel. But mostly she loved her family and pets. She and Ray always had room for someone who needed a place to call home, whether for a few days, or for a year or more. Many friends and relatives were hosted by them over the years, and thought of Ray and Marilyn as their “other parents.”

She is survived by her brother, David W. Pugsley, Sr.; her children, Diane (Jeff) Howell of St. Helens, Tina (Ron) Crook of St. Helens, John (Carol) Nordyke of Corvallis, and Kay Miller of Philomath; ten grandchildren, 12 great-grandchildren (with one on the way); and other extended family members. She was preceded in death by her parents and her husband Ramon.

Memorial services will be held Saturday, February 3, 11:00 am at McHenry Funeral Home, with a gathering immediately afterward at the Presbyterian Church Dennis Hall Community Center, 9th and Monroe, Corvallis.
