Thomas Edward Lee, 70, of Burnt Woods passed away in Corvallis surrounded by family on Nov. 21, 2016, at 1:50 a.m.

Tom was born in New Britain, Connecticut, on May 11, 1946, to Marjorie (Seeds) Lee and Melvin Lee.

Tom proudly served his country by joining the Army. His dates of service were from June 10, 1963 to July 9, 1968, during which time he completed three tours in Vietnam. Later in life he made three separate trips to Vietnam in an effort to see the country in a more peaceful state and to put to rest some of his internal conflicts that he struggled with.

In December of 1979 Tom and his wife, Madlyn, moved their family to Oregon. After six months in Corvallis they found a home in the Eddyville area. Nestled into that little community, Tom and Madlyn found their home. They raised their two daughters there surrounded by a tight knit community where they had many friends.

Tom had been a truck driver for many years, a logger, had done construction on everything from highways to schools. Eventually he retired due to injuries sustained during his military service. After retiring Tom moved to Playa del Carmen, Mexico, for about a decade. He made friends from all over the world and lived a life that most of us can only dream about. His easy going nature, generosity and dark witted humor will be missed by all that knew him.
