



Al Frost

June 15, 1922 - August 12, 2016

Albert E. Frost, 94, of Corvallis, OR, formally of 426 River Rd., Pawcatuck, CT, died at his home in Corvallis, surrounded by his family on Aug. 12th, 2016. He was born June 15, 1922 in Northbridge, MA. the son of Albert E. and Anna (Manniak) Frost. He married Helen Zemianek on Sept. 23, 1946 at St. Denis Church in East Douglas, MA.

He graduated from East Douglas grammar and high schools and in 1940 entered the College of the Holy Cross where he obtained his Bachelor and Master of Science degrees cum laude in chemistry in 1943 and 1944 respectively. He was a paratrooper with the 101st Airborne Division in WW II. After his honorable discharge from the army he enrolled in Clark University where he received his Doctorate in Organic Chemistry in 1949.

He worked at Wallace & Tiernan in Belleville, NJ from 1949-1952 and then at Bersworth Chemical Co. in Framingham, MA. In 1958 he joined the patent department of Pfizer Inc., where he remained until retiring in 1988 as assistant director of patents.

He is survived by his wife Helen of 70 years and his three daughters, Deborah of Sevierville, TN, Christina of Denver, CO, Pamela of Corvallis, OR and one son, Charles of Woodland Park, CO; twelve grandchildren, ten great grandchildren and two great-great grandchildren. He was predeceased by his younger brother Raymond who was killed on Saipan in WW II.

A Christian mass will be celebrated at St. Mary's church in Corvallis on Thursday, August 18 at 11:00 o'clock. Burial will be in St. Denis cemetery,

Douglas, MA.
