It was fun to stop by her work area to talk about her latest craft projects, sometimes she'd bring in samples for "show and tell." Every Christmas I pull out two small "beaded" angels that Alberta made and gave to me. I was one of the UHDS staff members who helped Alberta move out of the house on 4th street in Corvallis after her mother died, and after the move I coordinated the restoration and reupholstering of an old rattan chair that had been in her family for a long time. From helping with that move, I know how many boxes she had...so I wish you all well on what you still might have to sort out. I know through our conversations over the years that Alberta cherished her nieces and nephew, you were such an important part of her life.
