Alice M. Solberg, 99 of Philomath died Thursday at Good Samaritan Regional Medical Center. Alice was born on August 17, 1914 in Grand Rapids, Wisconsin to William and Bessie Olson. She graduated from nursing school in Chicago and served as a surgical nurse and an emergency room nurse in that area. She took the long train ride to Oregon after hearing from a fellow nurse of the excellent employment opportunities offered in Klamath Falls. In 1941, she married Carl Solberg. The couple had one son, Stephen. The family moved to Corvallis in 1954 where Carl attended Oregon State University and Alice worked at the college infirmary. Upon his graduation, they moved to "The Ranch," ten miles south of Philomath where Alice spent her days caring for their son and tending the cattle. She belonged to Neighborly Neighbors and enjoyed watching Perry Mason on TV and John Wayne movies. She was an excellent cook; her Swedish meatballs were always a big hit. She will be remembered for her kind heart and for being great Mom and Grandmother.

Alice is preceded in death by her husband, Carl who died in 1972.
