



Allan Douglas Hadley

July 15, 1940 - May 29, 2025

Allan Douglas Hadley passed away on May 29, 2025, in Corvallis, Oregon. He was born on July 15, 1940, in Dallas, Oregon.

Allan graduated from Albany Union High School and went on to complete his studies at Oregon Institute of Technology in 1960, specializing in electrical appliance repair. That same year, he volunteered for the draft and served in the U.S. Army until July 3, 1962. During his service, Allan was recognized for his exceptional technical skills—constructing bridges and laying minefields—which earned him equal rank and pay as a sergeant, though he declined the official title due to personal convictions.

Following his military service, Allan began a career as an electrician. He worked in the field for ten years before becoming a supervisor electrician, ultimately retiring in 2002. A man of great skill and craftsmanship, Allan built his own home and shop with care and precision.

In 1967, Allan embraced the Bahá'í Faith, which remained an important part of his life. He married Myrna Hadley and they shared 21 years together before her passing in 2009. Allan lovingly cared for her during her final months. He later married Roxanne Hadley, who survives.

Allan was the proud father of Mark Allan Hadley and Karl Douglas Hadley. He

also remembered his son Paul Hadley, who lived for 49 hours. His legacy continues through his grandchildren Annabell Veda Hadley and Miles Hadley, and great-grandchild Veda Hadley.

He was preceded in death by his older brother Macy Hadley.

Allan found joy in fishing and hunting and will be remembered for his dedication to family, craftsmanship, and quiet strength. May his memory bring comfort to those who knew him.
