Amey Anna Blaine passed away Friday, April 16, 2010 at home where she was happiest with a lake view and her children. She was 89. She was born in Lexington, Kentucky to Harvey and Hannah Massie. She was the youngest of eleven children. Amey married Edwin Lawrence(Bud) Blaine in Georgia on June 28, 1938. They had four children in North Carolina where Bud was a successful Singer Sewing Machine salesman. The family moved to Colorado for three years where they had their fifth child. Bud's mother became ill so the family moved back to North Carolina where they stayed until she died in 1960 then they all moved to Oregon to start a new life. Bud worked as a custodian and Amey as a cook at Perrydale School for 10 years. Bud became ill and left his job and Amey followed. They started the Perrydale Bargain Store across the street from their home and it became a popular place to purchase antiques and other merchandise. Amey closed the store after Bud died in 1980. In 1996 she moved to Monmouth Meadows Mobile Home Park. In 2006 she moved to Lakeshore Mobile Home Park to near her oldest daughter. Amey's life was filled with family gatherings around her picnic table. She will be missed by all her family and friends. She was a kind, loving woman. She is survived by daughters, Pat(Kevin) and Betty (Charles); sons, James Richard and Wayne(Odesia); grandchildren, Marty, Jerry, Tim, Tony, Tracy, Heidi, Marcy, Kelly, Brian and Sara.
