Art Schreiber of Corvallis passed away on Friday, Nov. 7, at the age of 91.

Art was a World War II veteran, having served in the U.S. Army 475th Infantry from 1943 through 1945 in the Central Burma India China Offensive.

He was born in Cleveland, Ohio, and was the oldest of nine siblings. He married his high school sweetheart, Isabel, in April of 1942. Art was a tool and die machinist for 30 years at Cleveland Pneumatic Tool. In 1963, he and his family moved to Southern California, where he continued working as a machinist.

Art was a great handyman, and in the 1980s and 1990s helped build his two children and their spouses their dream homes.

In 1993, Art and Isabel moved to Corvallis. Art loved being outdoors with their dog, Maggie. He was an avid gardener and fruit tree grower. He raised mason bees for pollination, and gave away vegetable seedlings to the Children's Farm Home in Corvallis. Family, neighbors and friends enjoyed the wonderful harvests each year. Art and his bounty will be missed.

Art is survived by Isabel, his wife of 72 years. He also is survived by his son Art (Janis) of Groveland, California; daughter Anita Sonn (Bob) of Philomath;

brothers Joe, Bill and Bob (Susan) of Ohio; and sisters Mary Ann Bartlett (Ed) of Ohio and Margaret Wencil (Larry) of South Carolina. He was preceded in death by his parents, Arthur and Alma; brothers Howard and Larry; and sister "Sis."

Art will be interred at a later date at Willamette National Cemetery in Portland, with full military honors.
