Brandon was passionate about playing soccer, and said it was the one thing that always made him happy.

Brandon loved music and was a great singer and dancer, an extremely talented writer, and a perfectionist, almost to a fault. Brandon loved the spirit of life, and loved to see people flourish, grow and change for the better. He loved helping and taking care of others, even though he was unable to help or take care of himself.

He enjoyed seeing new places and doing new things, was always willing to

take on new adventures, and always liked them. Water and snow sport adventures were some of his favorites, and he had no fear of pushing himself to the limit. So many people loved and cared for Brandon; he will be greatly missed and always remembered.
