



## Burma Jodene Lane

June 12, 1944 - December 26, 2013

Burma Jodene (Jody) Lane was born June 12, 1944, in Toledo to Joseph and Verdene (LaBare) Williams.

She lived most of her life in Wren, graduating from Philomath High School with the Class of 1962.

One of her first jobs was as a carhop at the A&W restaurant that was at Sixth Street and Western Boulevard in Corvallis. She then worked for PayLess Drugstore when it was in downtown Corvallis, followed by a clerical position at Oregon State University. She retired as a concrete mason working for Walt's Concrete, where she had traveled from job to job with her husband, Fred.

Jody enjoyed crafting, especially making jewelry with a wide variety of beads and wires.

Jodene had a deep connection to her Native American heritage, and was an elder of the Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians.

Jody passed after a long battle with kidney disease.

She is survived by her husband of 52 years, Fred Lane; daughter, Wendy Lane; stepchildren Terry and Connie Lane; brothers Wendell (Sharri) Williams,

Jeff (Deborah) Williams and Zach Williams; and her sister, Dixie Lee. She leaves behind many wonderful nieces and nephews. She was preceded in death by both parents; a baby brother, John; and brother Willie Norwood Williams.
