best. He called forth a higher standard. He breathed life and joy into his family. They lived FULLY! He may have pulled back a little from parental shepherding.... because he didn't need it! He was flying beautifully on his own and his heart was on the Lord. He was living and breathing the firm foundation YOU and Jesus had laid with him... "When he is old, he won't depart from it."

You will see your wonderful son again. This is not "IT".

I'm Cameron's Uncle Jim. A couple of the slides in the AZ memorial shows Cameron wakeboarding behind our boat as well as driving it. We wake boarded with Cameron a lot when he lived up in Portland. He was a good wakeboarder.

A little background in wakeboarding or water skiing. To get the boarder/skier up properly you should idle the boat away from the skier and when the rope is taut you SLOWLY pull them out of the water.

On one summer outing, I couldn't idle the motor because I didn't winterize the motor and the low-speed jets were plugged. I had to go from start to faster than idle fairly quickly, so it could be a fast jerky pull out of the water.

Well, as I said Cameron was a good wakeboarder with lots of experience so with this idling problem all he said was JUST GO! He didn't have any problem getting up and had a good ski.
