



## Charles Anderson

October 19, 1918 - February 17, 2010

Charles “Lloyd” Anderson, 91, died at home on February 17.

Lloyd was born in Portland, Oregon, to Eric and Catherine Anderson. He graduated from Grant High School and Oregon State University. As a bomber pilot during World War II serving in the South Pacific, he received the Distinguished Flying Cross and two purple hearts. He married Jo Anne Russell of Corvallis and settled on the family farm in the Crescent Valley area after the war where they raised their six children.

Beginning in 1960, he served as Benton County Assessor for twenty-four years. Lloyd loved working on his farm, raising animals and harvesting crops. Well into his eighties, he still rose daily at 6 am to feed his cows.

After retirement from Benton County, he and Jo Anne traveled the world visiting relatives and friends and studying forestry practices. Jo Anne died in 1999 while they were visiting Chile.

Survivors (and spouses) include Joe Anderson (Karen), Eric Anderson (Kathie Humby), Pete Anderson (Debbie), Phil Anderson (Pat Glazier), Ole Ersson (Maitri), and Karen Anderson, 12 grandchildren, and 7 great grandchildren.

A memorial service will be held Thursday, February 25, from 2pm at the Unitarian Church, 2945 NW Circle Blvd. In lieu of flowers, the family encourages donations to the Corvallis Boys and Girls Club.
