



## Cleve Alvin Williams

April 3, 1933 - March 7, 2015

Cleve A. Williams, a longtime Corvallis resident, peacefully died March 7, 2015, at Samaritan Evergreen Hospice House in Albany.

Cleve was born April 8, 1933, in The Dalles. He was raised in Peru. Cleve attended Columbia Preparatory School in Portland, and graduated with a bachelor's degree from Whitman College in Washington, where he was on the football team.

Cleve served in the U.S Army from 1953 to 1956 and was attached to the security division.

Cleve's professional career was with Signal Oil, which later became ExxonMobil. He also was a real estate broker, and had a property management license.

Some of Cleve's favorite things were Steen's Mountain, coaching youth football and pheasant hunting with his bird dogs.

Cleve was very active in Ducks Unlimited. He also was a member of the Elks Lodge and the Kiwanis Club, and served on the Benton County Parks Department, working on the restoration of Fort Hoskins. He also was a member of the First Presbyterian Church Board of Trustees.

Mr. Williams is survived by his wife, Mary; son, John; daughter, Skyla; granddaughter, Sierra; and sister, Lea Topping of Alexandria, Virginia.

A memorial service will take place at 2 p.m. Thursday, March 12, at First Presbyterian Church in Corvallis. In lieu of flowers, memorial donations can be made to the church or Evergreen Hospice House.
