Dana Lou Allen passed away on October 26, 2022 at age 76 with her daughter and granddaughter by her side. She was born at Camp Pendleton where her parents were stationed during WWII. She is buried in the Oddfellows Pioneer Cemetery next to her father. She was a vibrant, unique person and she will be missed by all who knew her. “We’re all stories in the end. Just make it a good one.” She certainly did.
