David Lee White, 90 died Sunday at his home in Bellfountain. Born May 15, 1920 in Teigen, Montana, he was the son of David William and Rosa Anna Putney White. The family moved to Madrid, Iowa when David was six years old. He graduated from Madrid High school in 1939 and served in the US Navy aboard the USS Milwaukee during World War II. He received a purple heart for injuries received during an attack by a wolf pack of enemy submarines. After his military service, he married Darlene Joan Richards on April 28, 1949. The couple had three children, Wayne, Davy and Debbie. David was employed as a logger, and also worked for a time as a millwright for Georgia Pacific. He later worked for the Postal Service in Springfield, and retired in 1982 after 17 years of service. His family is a Rodeo Family, and he cherished those times with them. He also enjoyed playing cards in his leisure time, golfing and hunting.

David is survived by his wife of 61 years, Darlene; sons and daughters in law Wayne and Evie White, Davy and Donna White; daughter and son in law Debbie and Jerry Howell; seven grandchildren and nine great grandchildren. A visitation will be held from 2:00 pm to 4:00 pm on Friday, August 27th at McHenry Funeral Home in Corvallis. A Funeral Service will take place at 10:30 am on Saturday, August 28th at the Monroe Church of Christ. A graveside service at Bellfountain Cemetery with military honors will follow the funeral.
