DIANE M. TANNER, 73, of Philomath, OR died at Samaritan Evergreen Hospice House in Albany on Easter Sunday, 12 Apr 2020. She was born Diane Randolph Markland 14 May 1946 to Frank Randolph Markland and Mary Jeanette Reed in Takoma Park MD (Only child).

In 1964 she graduated from Temple City High School, the (Rams), Temple City, Los Angeles County, CA, where she was active in several clubs and was uniform manager for the Band.

She was a student at Oregon State University and Southern Oregon College 1965-1966. She became a life-long OSU fan and for a short time was Benny Beaver. During that period she adopted the name "Margie" and was known by that name by friends and family.

She held many jobs over the years including working for I Magnin, May Co, and Lipman's. She worked for Kelly Services in Longview WA, and Strategic Staffing in Corvallis.

She followed her father who was active in the Masonic organization and served as "Worthy Matron" in several chapters of Eastern Star in Washington and Oregon.

In 1971 she married Gary Rose and lived in Kingston WA (across the bay from Seattle) while he was stationed in Washington, until they divorced in May 1977.

In Aug 1977 she married David Wannamaker and they divorced in Feb 1992. They lived in Vancouver Washington and there became active members of the

local grange, being recognized as “Washington State Grange Couple of the Year.”

She next was briefly married to Don Terrell in Medford.

In 2003 she again married Paul Tanner, to whom she was happily married until his passing.

Diane joined the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in 1997 and was an active member as her health permitted.

Her ashes, together with her late husband Paul Tanner’s, will be transported back to Elizabeth cemetery, in Pittsburgh PA, where they will be interred with her parents, at her mother’s family plot.
