Dorothy Maxine Hohman (Perry) – wife, mother, bookkeeper, gardener, avid reader – passed peacefully, at home, Wednesday March 30, 2016, following a short hospital stay. She was 6 weeks from her 90th birthday.

Dorothy was born in Hartford Kansas on May 9, 1926, to Othello Fidelia and Bertha Marie (Bland) Perry. She graduated from Burlington High School in 1944. Her only sibling, Othello Jr., was killed on Okinawa in 1945.

She met her true love, Charles William Hohman, while he was studying at The College of Emporia. In 1950, they married in The 1st Methodist Church of Emporia, and then resided in Scandia Kansas for 6 years before moving to Corvallis Oregon.

They have 1 child, Susan. She and Chuck bought The City Barber Shop in 1967, where they stayed till he retired in 1996.
