



Eileen Isabelle Stevens

March 18, 1916 - May 18, 2014

Eileen R. Stevens, 98, of Corvallis died Sunday, May 18, at Samaritan Evergreen Hospice House.

Eileen was born on March 18, 1916, in Youngstown, Ohio. She was raised in Niles, Ohio, and graduated from Baldwin Wallace University in Berea, Ohio, in 1938. She married Robert H. Stevens on July 22, 1938. The couple had two children, Robert and Suzanne. Eileen taught English for 23 years in Washington, D.C., and Bloomfield, New Jersey.

After moving to California, Eileen was a technical writer/editor at SRI in Menlo Park, California, retiring at age 82. She was a longtime resident of California until 2003, when she moved to Corvallis to be near her daughter.

Eileen was a circuit preacher for the Methodist Church during her summer breaks at Baldwin Wallace. She later was a member of Menlo Park Presbyterian Church in Menlo Park, California, and was active in the women's group there. Eileen was an avid reader, and played the piano and organ. Most recently, she was a resident of Regent Court at Corvallis Memory Care, as she suffered from Alzheimer's disease.

Eileen is survived by her two children, Robert R. Stevens of Alturas, California, and Suzanne S. Marple of Depoe Bay (formerly of Corvallis); seven

grandchildren, Darci L. Papoulias of North Royalton, Ohio, Rebecca A. Sanne of Great Falls, Montana, Matthew Marple of Phoenix, Arizona, Kevin Stevens of Sacramento, California, Troy Stevens and Steve Stevens of Yuba City, California, and Jeff Stevens of Cottonwood, California; 11 great-grandchildren; and one great-great-grandchild.

Eileen will be remembered for her smile and sense of humor.

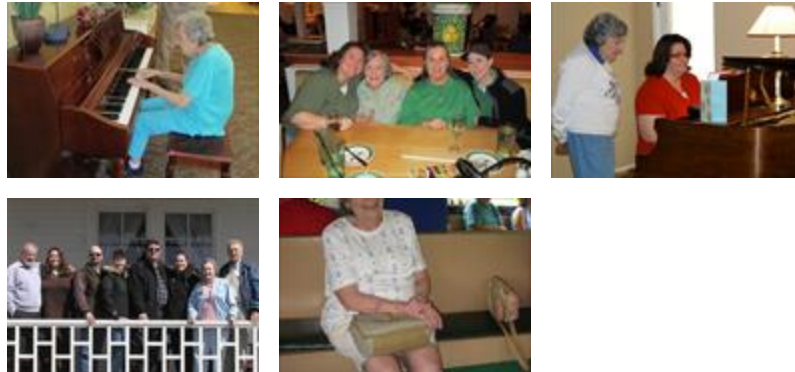
