Faye Margaret Allen, the oldest child of Earl and Blanche Allen, was born on Dec. 13, 1915, in Oregon City.

She was raised in Oregon City, graduating from Oregon City High School. Faye attended Oregon State College, quitting after her freshman year to marry Eugene Brosh. Together they raised five children. They resided in Philomath for 35 years, until Eugene passed away. She then returned to Oregon State University, earning both a bachelor's and a master's degree in Special Education.

She taught elementary school, and traveled to England and Ireland. In 1979, she married a former high school sweetheart, Kenneth Price. They were married 18 years, until he passed away in 1997. Shortly thereafter, Faye moved to Beaverton. She passed away, at age 98, on Saturday, Oct. 11.

Faye is survived by five adult children: Charles, Larry, Helen, Joe and Jim, plus numerous grandchildren and great-grandchildren.
