



## Heather Jean -MacArthur Wilcox

April 10, 1941 - April 14, 2018

Heather Wilcox of Tangent, Oregon died Saturday, April 14.

She was the daughter of Alexander and Lois Ivy MacArthur. She was born in Consort, Alberta, Canada and spent the first ten years of her life nearby, on a farm about four miles west of Kirriemuir, Alberta. These were happy days spent with her many brothers and sisters. When her parents died she came to the USA to live with relatives.

She attended Parkrose Junior High School in Portland, and graduated from Clackamas High School in Portland.

Having been hospitalized and very ill as a child, her lifelong ambition was to become a Registered Nurse. This was accomplished by graduating from Good Samaritan School of nursing in 1962. She worked for several years, primarily in Klamath Falls, Livermore, California and

Corvallis.

After nursing school, she married Steve Wilcox of Hood River. They became the proud parents of one daughter, Janice Lynn and one son, Daniel Steven.

Steve and Janice preceded her in death in 2008 and 2010.

She is survived by her son, Dan and daughter-in-law Chris of Tangent. She also has one surviving sister, Mary Munro of Swan Hills, Alberta and a partner, Rodney McDowell of Tangent.

She was preceded in death by siblings, Laura VanNest, Dorothy Giles, George Adkin; brothers, Donald (Bud) MacArthur, Malcolm (Mac) MacArthur; and sisters, Phyllis Margaret (Margie) Hegan and Nora Lee Owen.

Her love and concern for the well-being of her family was the most important thing in life to her.

She had many pets that brought her great joy and she was an avid supporter of several animal rights organizations and was always willing to give whatever efforts she could to improve their welfare.
