



## Jackie Pyper Myrold

October 19, 1955 - October 10, 2024

Jacqueline Pyper Myrold, born on October 19, 1955, in Riverside, California, passed away peacefully at home on October 10, 2024, in Corvallis, Oregon.

She was the daughter of Arthur Gordon Pyper and Joye Bruce Pyper.

Jacqueline married David Myrold on August 14, 1979, in the Salt Lake Temple in Utah. Together, they shared a life filled with love and dedication to family and community. Jacqueline is survived by her three children: Kirk Myrold, Alan Myrold, and Becky Myrold, as well as, her cherished grandchildren, Violet Myrold and Thorger Myrold. She was preceded in death by her beloved husband, David Myrold, and her mother, Joye Pyper.

Jacqueline graduated from Michigan State University and earned a Master of Science in Forestry from the University of Idaho. A homemaker by choice, Jacqueline devoted her time to volunteering throughout the community. She was actively involved with Oregon State University, the local school district, the city library, and she played an important role in youth sports and church activities. She was also an avid flute player, performing from her youth through the university marching band and later with both the Corvallis Community Band and local theater programs.

At age 40, Jacqueline was diagnosed with multiple sclerosis. Despite this challenge, she became an advocate for others with MS, volunteering with the MS Society and supporting those affected by the disease.
