Jessica Noel Jackson 28 of Corvallis, passed away Saturday, November 9th.

Jessica was born February 8, 1985 in Corvallis. She was raised in Corvallis and attended Fairplay Elementary, Cheldelin Middle School and Crescent Valley High School. Jessica was a cheerleader at Crescent Valley and graduated in 2003.

Jessica possessed a warm, open and adventurous spirit. Her sense of adventure led her to Florida shortly after high school, where she lived and worked for several years. She returned to Oregon, working at Old Navy in Albany. Eventually, she moved to Portland, where she worked at Bed, Bath & Beyond. Jess came back to Corvallis and worked at Oregon State University. She had recently begun attending Linn-Benton Community College.

Jess was involved in independent filmmaking in Portland. She appeared in several movies, including the documentary, "I Heart Monster Movies" and the spoof film "I Am Virgin." She has a starring role in the upcoming movie, "Chillers." Jess was featured in a 2012 calendar, appearing as a voodoo priestess.

Jess loved to travel. Frequent traveling companions were her sister, Jennifer and her mother, Sandra. The trio went to Jamaica and Hawaii, and many

other trips throughout Oregon. A favorite destination was Nye Beach on the Oregon Coast. Jessica took day trips there with her mother to see the sunset and feed the seagulls. Jessica also had a love for animals, and had rescued many stray cats.

Jessica is survived by her mother Sandra I. Schomberg and step-father Louis Woods of Corvallis; sisters Lisa D. Coleman of Corvallis and Jennifer L. Loomis of Portland; brother Christopher H. Jackson of Corvallis and father Leon Jackson of Albany.
