



Joseph Carpenter Strickling

February 6, 1977 - April 13, 2014

Joseph C. Strickling, 37, passed away on a sunny spring Sunday in Corvallis, surrounded by his family and his caregivers.

Joe was born in Bozeman, Mont., to Michael and Beth Hulet Strickling. He was their third child. Shortly after his birth, his parents were told by the delivering doctor that Joe had had a twin sibling in the womb with him who had not survived. They later learned that Joe had cerebral palsy.

Joe and his family lived in Three Forks, Mont. In 1978, they moved to Jefferson after Joe's dad got a teaching job at Fir Grove Elementary School. They then moved to Albany in 1983.

Joe began his schooling in Albany, starting at Riverside Elementary School. Joe also attended Waverly Elementary School and Liberty Elementary School, as well as Memorial Middle School and South Albany High School, from which he graduated in 1995. After graduation, he entered the SAHS Community Living Skills class and stayed in that program until he turned 21.

Joe was excited to leave home in 1998 to begin his new life at the Mumford House group home in Corvallis. Besides living at Mumford House, he also lived in Woods House and Stone Street House. He loved watching and interacting with his caregivers and being a part of their lives. But most of all he

enjoyed being outside in the community, shopping, working and going to events.

Wherever he went, Joe made lasting friends. Although he sat in a wheelchair a great deal, and endured frequent pain, Joe loved to smile, first and foremost. His sincere, big smile, along with his laugh and sense of humor, were his social tools, and became his most endearing trademarks. They were genuine expressions of his personality and he effectively used them throughout his life to connect with people.

He always was a sociable person, and enjoyed and valued the company of others.

Joseph is survived by his parents, Michael and Beth of Albany; his brother, Jonathan, and wife, Amy, of Novato, Calif.; sister, Rebecca Greaves, and husband, Eric, of Salem; sister, Rachel Herring, and husband, Christopher, of Salem; nieces Kate, Lena, Violet, London and Piper; and nephews Kaden, Zach, Jamison and Julian.

A memorial service will take place at 3 p.m. Saturday, April 26, at the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, 1615 28th Ave. S.E., Albany..
