Joseph Rocco Trifari died Wednesday, June 22, 2011, at Stoneybrook Assisted Living in Corvallis. He was 61.

Joseph was born on Nov. 23, 1949, in Paterson, N.J., to Anthony and Teresa Trifari. He attended St. Anthony School in Hawthorne, N.J., and in 1964 moved to Phoenix, Ariz., where he attended Maryvale High School. At the age of 17, he joined the U.S. Army and served in the Vietnam War until his honorable discharge in 1969.

He worked as a general sales manager for Hostess Cakes in the Los Angeles and Phoenix areas, and later owned and operated the Hawaii Baking Company in Aiea, Hawaii. He moved to Corvallis in 2005 to be near his daughter and grandchildren.

Survivors include his son, Ryan, and Michele Trifari; his daughter, Tracy, and Bob Lengwin; his grandchildren, Carson, Maci and Jaxon Lengwin, and Lylah Trifari; three brothers, Anthony, Ronald and Michael Trifari; sister, Natalie Aisoff; and step-mother, Delores Keene.
