Kenneth L. McCormick, 52 died Wednesday at Good Samaritan Regional Medical Center in Corvallis. Born May 8, 1956 in Corvallis; he was the son of William Lee and Ethel Jean (Graham) McCormick. Ken graduated from Corvallis High School in 1974. In his youth, he was an avid motocross racer. After graduation, he worked for Brand S Corporation as a grader until 1991. Since 1991 he was employed as a fabricator for L & M Industrial Fabricating where he was an iconic staple and will be missed by all his co-workers. He married Teri Hultberg on September 23, 1988 in Corvallis. Ken enjoyed working in his yard and spending time with his family. He and Teri recently took up walking and he enjoyed that time they spent together very much. When his children were growing up, he took great pride in being involved in their sports activities—attending every practice “even when he wasn’t invited.” He was a great story teller and had the gift of making people laugh.
