Lucile Charlotte Hines was born in Denova, Colorado, after her parents emigrated from Iowa in 1911. She often shared stories of growing up during the Great Depression and going to school on horseback.

In 1935 Lucile married her husband, Walter. Together they had three children. Walter pastored various churches for 42 years while Lucile taught piano, Sunday school, directed choir and counseled married couples.

In 1971 Walter retired. They then founded a girls' parole group home. Tri-Center homes served hundreds of teenage girls from 1971-1995.

After Tri-center closed Lucile moved to Philomath. She enjoyed chatting on the phone with family and friends, going to church, and visiting with family. She spent her life serving people, she loved people. Her passion in life was reading the Bible and sharing Christ with everybody she met.

She was preceded in death by her son, Eldon, and husband Walt.

She is survived by her children, Edith and husband Jerry, and Neva Shannon; nine grandchildren, 22 great-grandchildren and seven great-great-

grandchildren; as well as many foster children and grandchildren.

Visitation will be at noon Friday, May 27, at College United Methodist Church in Philomath. A funeral service will follow at 1 p.m.
