



Lydia Jane Pinkston

December 18, 1927 - April 10, 2018

Lydia J. Pinkston, age 90 of Corvallis died on April 10 at her home with family at her side after a short battle with cancer.

Lydia Jane was born December 18, 1927 in Nashwauk, Minnesota to Lydia J. (Carlson) and John J. Miller. She grew up in Nashwauk and graduated from Nashwauk High School in 1945. Lydia attended Hibbing Junior College, Itasca Junior College and St. Cloud State Teacher's College, graduating in 1949 with a degree in education. She taught in Grand Rapids, Minnesota before moving to Oregon where she taught in Cottage Grove and there met the love of her life, Louis Pinkston, at a teachers' picnic.

Lydia and Louis were married on Dec. 27, 1952 in Portland, living in Cottage Grove before moving to Corvallis in 1956. She worked as a reading lab assistant at Franklin Elementary School and as the librarian at Garfield Elementary School.

Lydia enjoyed travelling with Louie touring the United States in an RV, playing cards, Bob Dylan and Beatles music, attending spring training baseball games in Arizona, visiting family in Minnesota and gathering with her beloved bridge group.

She is survived by her children, Jane (Mark) Fischer of Lilliwaup, Washington,

David (Chely) of Klamath Falls, John (Jayne) of Chandler Arizona; grandchildren, Andrea, Pamela, Kalena, Greg, John Paul and Natalie Pinkston, Sydney (Andrew) Clayton of Spanaway, Washington; three great-grandchildren, Alexis, Brianna and Elena Clayton; sister, Carolyn Hakim of Palm Springs, California; and many nieces and nephews who loved her dearly.

She was preceded in death by her parents; husband, Louis on December 17, 1998; son, Paul Marvin Pinkston on February 14, 1981; brothers, John and William, sister, Margaret Ringsred and daughter-in-law, Karen Pinkston.

A Memorial Mass of Christian Burial celebrating Lydia's life will be at 11 a.m. on Saturday, June 9 at St. Mary's Catholic Church in Corvallis with a reception following. Burial will be at St. Mary's Cemetery, Corvallis.
