



## Mildred Krumperman

January 15, 1922 - January 13, 2013

Mildred Taggart Krumperman peacefully passed away on Jan. 13, 2013, in Auburn, Wash., just two days short of her 91st birthday.

She was born Jan. 15, 1922, in Morgan, Utah, to George Theron and Almira Condie Taggart.

Mildred graduated in 1940 from Ogden High School. She married her high school sweetheart, Paul Henry Krumperman, on Sept. 11, 1942, in Ogden, Utah. They were sealed on March 29, 1957, in the Logan Latter-day Saints temple. After World War II, the family lived in Utah and several locations in California. In 1966 they moved to Corvallis, where Mildred worked as an administrative assistant for the Oregon State University Extension Service and Paul taught food science at the university.

A lifelong member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, Mildred gave devoted service in a variety of capacities in all the church auxiliary organizations and as an ordinance worker in the Portland LDS temple.

Widowed since 1984, she moved in 2006 to Auburn to be closer to family members.

Our loving mother was preceded in death by her brother, LaMar Taggart, and by her sister, Phyllis (Ray) Lewis.

She is survived by her sisters Faye (Gene, deceased) Sanders and JoAnne (Bryan) Cady; her brother, Keith (RaNee, deceased) Taggart; and half-sister Joyce (Dennis) Porter. She also is survived by her children, Karen Krumperman of Mt. Baldy, Calif., Jeffrey (Gwen) Krumperman of Nauvoo, Ill.,

and Paula (Jett) Thompson of Maple Valley, Wash.; 11 grandchildren; and 20 great-grandchildren.

Graveside services for family and close friends will take place at 1 p.m.

Monday, Jan. 21, at Oaklawn Memorial Park in Corvallis.
