Myrna N. Hadley, 63 died in her Corvallis home on Sunday. Born October 13, 1946 in Cebu City, Philippines, she was the daughter of Facundo and Fedila Candia Nacario. She was a market researcher and also taught history while in the Philippines. She married Allan Hadley in January of 1990 and after six months, they moved to the United States. Four years later she became a naturalized citizen. Myrna was a production worker at National Frozen Food until her retirement in 2002. She enjoyed writing and composing poetry. She wrote a book about her life. She will be remembered as a kind and giving person, always willing to help others. Her nieces who live here in the states considered her their substitute mother, and always looked to her for words of wisdom and counted on her to know just the right thing to say.

Preceded in death by her parents and her sister Licinia Nacario; Myrna is survived by her loving husband of 20 years, Allan Hadley; one brother Galelio Nacario; two nieces who live in the U. S. Dafne DeSautel and Rica May Roe; and numerous nieces and nephews in the Philippines.
