Neal passed away at home in Corvallis, Oregon. Neal was born in Guernsey County, Ohio. He was the son of Clyde and Edna Milligan.

Neal graduated from Cambridge, Ohio, High School, The United States Navy Great Lakes Electronics School and The Ohio State University College of Engineering.
