“ *My Friend Paul*

My arrival at OSU was a fluke, but a great one. My best friend in high school was a star varsity BB player for Ben Neff, the great coach at Lowell in SF. He had waited for a scholarship and finally decided we ought to go to OSU and play BB. I was set to go to UC, but OSU had an outstanding Forestry school --I said OK. As the train pulled out, he came running along side yelling he was going to St Marys. That Fall in 1948, the new BB recruits plus a legion of walk-ons tried for a few spots. Enter Paul, in charge of running three full court games in the old Men's Gym. Paul made a point of knowing all of us and being from SF, more recently Fairfax, plus being half Italian, we had fun talking about relatives and the Bay Area. But alas, fast hands and a good shot could not overcome being short and not up to Slat's needs for his great teams of '48 and '49. We often would shoot buckets after practice. Paul was special with all his players. Upon returning as a faculty member, Paul and I would always exchange an Italian greeting followed by "How are things going Van?" That is how we have greeted each other for 66 years. Always upbeat, always kind, and always loving with wonderful Fran. Paul will always hold a special place in my heart!
