Regina Theresa Hall passed away peacefully in the company of her family and caregivers on May 20th. Regina was born to Himmel and Alois Gah on May 25, 1917. She is survived by her son, Bill Hall (Susan Small Hall) of Corvallis; Lois Hall of Marietta, Georgia; grandchildren Laura Hall Donovan (Paul and great granddaughter Kyley) of Yarmouth, Maine; grandson Billy Hall of Oakland, California; granddaughter Beth Hall and great grandson Ryan of Marietta, Georgia; and her sister, Pauline Fischer of Munich, Germany. Regina married Willhelm Gunther in June 1939. They had one child, Bill Gunther Hall in January, 1943. Wilhelm was killed on the Russian front on February, 1943.

In 1947, she immigrated to the United States. There she married Frank Hall. He preceded her in death in 1991. For many years she worked as a pediatric nurse for New York State for mentally challenged children. She retired in 1981,

In 2004, she moved to Corvallis where she resided at the Corvallis Caring Place and for the past four years at Twin Firs Adult Foster Care. There she was under the loving care of Doris Hannon and her loving and dedicated caregivers. For the past year, she was also cared for by the wonderful people of Benton Hospice Services.

Regina lived through many tragedies in her life, but she never complained. She was dedicated to her faith. She was always giving; sometimes she took the disadvantaged into her home. She was an avid reader. She was bilingual

in English and German. She loved flowers, the opera and politics—especially John F. Kennedy.
