Renata Jadwiga Budzilowicz Wnuk, 81, of Corvallis passed away on Aug. 12, 2015, in her home.

She was born in Bialystok, Poland, to Alexander and Jadwiga (Sudlitz) Budzilowicz. The family moved to Torun, Poland, when Renata was very young. There Renata started playing the piano. She fell in love with the piano and attended music school and regular public school. She moved to Krakow, Poland, to attend Jagiellonian University where she received her master's degree in piano. She performed as a concert pianist and taught higher level students upon completing university. She enjoyed teaching and frequently chaperoned mountain trips for her students. She married Michael P. Wnuk in the '60s and left Poland to move with him to Pasadena, California, where he had received a job offer at Caltech University. The couple lived there for a few years before relocating to Brookings, South Dakota. There the couple was employed at South Dakota State University. Renata worked as a research assistant at Olson Biochemistry labs. They had one child, Jennifer Wnuk.

In 2009, Renata moved to Corvallis to be closer to her daughter's family.

Over her lifetime she delighted in music, nature, dancing, laughter, friends, family and travel. Her hobbies included gardening, cooking, embroidery and sewing. She loved her grandson, Marley, and being close to him was

wonderful for both of them. She spearheaded many pierogi making sessions. She continued to travel to Poland frequently and missed her homeland dearly. She was a spirited adventurer and the life of the party at any gathering.

She is survived by sister Danuta Budzilowicz; daughter Jennifer Wnuk; son-in-law Scott Clark; and grandson Marley Clark.

She was preceded in death by her parents and ex-husband Michael.

There will be a memorial service at 3 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 19, at Samaritan Village, 285 N.W. 35th St., Corvallis.
