Robert “Bob” Beach, 90 of Corvallis died Saturday, June 13th at Corvallis Manor.

Bob was born November 19, 1924 to Homer and Ernestine Roberts Beach. He was born on the family farm, where he lived most of his life. He served in the United States Army during World War II. After his service he married Pauline Scheihing on August 17, 1946. The couple had 6 children Linda, Larry, Rob, Randy, Kendra and Karlene. Bob worked as a Concrete Truck Driver for Corvallis Sand and Gravel which later became Green and White Rock Products. He was affectionately known as “The Mixer Man.”

Horses were always a large part of his life. From early childhood he loved horses and later raised and raced thoroughbred horses. He served on the Benton County Mounted Sheriff’s Posse and was on the Board of Directors of The Oregon Thoroughbred Breeders Association. Everywhere he went, he made friends. He will be remembered as a man “who loved life and loved people.”

Bob was preceded in death by his wife Pauline who died in 2003; his daughter Kendra Sue Biel and four sisters. He is survived by his daughter and son in law Linda and Dave Hannah; sons Larry Beach and Rob Beach; son and daughter in law Randy and Betty Beach; daughter and son in law Karlene and

Gary Martin; son-in-law Steve Biel; sister Dottie Jackson; 9 grandchildren Rebecca, Rachel, Michelle, Bridgette, Brandon, Kerenza, Keenan, Clay, Emily; 10 great grandchildren and numerous nieces and nephews.
