



Victoria Suzanne Eastwood

April 9, 1973 - April 12, 2021

On April 12, 2021, wife and mother Victoria Eastwood gently passed after a yearlong battle with cancer.

Born in Denver, Colorado, on April 9, 1973, Victoria grew up in Emaus, Pennsylvania and attended Kutztown University receiving a BA of Fine Arts. She moved to Gilbert, Arizona, where Victoria met her true love and life partner Aaron, while working in Chandler at the San Marcos Resort. The two wed in June 1999. Daughter, Grace arrived in 2003 in Denver, Colorado. Victoria and Aaron then moved to Aloha, Oregon, with Kai arriving in 2007. Her children were everything to Victoria and personified her own spirit – kind, generous, loving, and strong.

The family settled in Corvallis, Oregon, where Victoria spent the last 13 years in the art department at Crescent Valley High School. Not only did Victoria teach painting, photography, drawing, and other fine arts, she created an environment where students navigating social and emotional issues found a safe space and support from an understanding adult. Victoria was selfless with her time and advocacy on behalf of her students. She was loved by her students and well respected by her peers. She would do anything to help a student, a fellow teacher, and her friends.

She loved camping with her family, going to museums, traveling the world,

creating crafts, and always learning new techniques for her art classes.

Victoria is also survived by her husband, Aaron Jensen, her children, Grace and Kai, her mother Deborah Eastwood, father Douglas Ashely, aunts Carol Cummings, Kathleen Carey, Linda Carey, and uncles Tom Carey, Mike Carey and Randy Cummings. Cousins, Thomas Carey, Kathleen Carey, Jennifer Crouch, Rebecca Carey, Bill Carey, Bill Frizell.

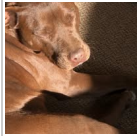

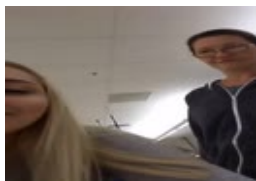
